## **Breaking Through Genealogy Brick Walls**

October is National Family History Month. This is a great opportunity to talk about family history and make sure your family story is being preserved. Sometimes in genealogy you hit a "brick wall" which can be quite frustrating. Perhaps you have an ancestor who seemingly refuses, despite repeated attempts, to reveal their origins. No matter how hard a family historian tries, they are unable to move past this ancestor. In this presentation, presented by the Clark County Historical Society we'll discuss the most common kinds of brick walls and offer some tricks and alternative
